Naomi, your Green Team and Sileby locals get to work to make path safe again



In May the Green Team and some local residents got together to tackle an alleyway and discovered that it had a dangerous amount of litter behind a broken fence. Not only was this unsighlty but it posed a real risk to residents.

Naomi reported the issue to the coucil and we are pleased to report that it has since been cleared away. Naomi said "the amount and type of rubbish that had accumulated was not pleasant for local residents and was a hazard to anyone who walked past it, particularly children and animals." We will now go and litter pick the last remaining rubbish. We wish to prevent this happening again, so have been in touch with the relevant councils to arrange for the hedge to be replaced and for the fence to be fixed. This will make the walkway pleasant for all to use. Join us on 10th September at 11am to litter pick.



FLOOD PREVENTION

We need to act now to reduce flooding issues

Flooding is a key issue for Sileby, which experiences huge disruption in winter from road closures due to floods. Naomi has contacted Jane Junt MP to ask about plans to clean up the river bed. Water level is currently low, an ideal time to remove weeds and debris which contribute to the flooding. Along with local residents we have become increasingly concerned about the pennywort growth in the brook. After contacting the Environment Agency we were informed of their plan to spray the pennywort 3 times between now and next spring. Naomi said "While we were pleased to hear the Environment Agency was aware of the issue, we do not think that repeated spraying will be an effective solution. Not only is the use of herbicides damaging to other flora and fauna, evidence from across the UK has shown that physical removal of the pennywort is much more effective in the long term. We have also contacted the Canal River Trust, who have supported the effort elsehwere to remove pennywort and have requested their support.

Faye acts on the concerns of residents



ENERGY REBATE DUE IN OCTOBER

How you can ensure you're getting help

The Energy Bills Support Scheme announced by the Govertment entitles every household that pays an energy bill to a £400 reduction over the winter. You do you not have to pay this back. It will be applied in monthly installments from October to March. If you pay by direct debit, your monthly payment will be automically reduced. You do not have to apply. Households on prepaid meters are also entitled to it and your energy supplier should let you know how they will be applying the discount.
