PETITION TO SAVE THE NO.2 BUS

The Green Team have been voicing the concerns of residents

The no.2 bus was the **only bus that went from Sileby and Cossington to Leicester**. Now that this has ceased the only public transport is the inaccessible train which doesn't run on Sundays. This has caused huge disruption and distress for residents.

Faye says **"it's not good enough to allow public transport to be cut**

during a climate and cost of living crisis. The people of Sileby want a reliable bus service." Due to this cut, **Cossington will now have no public transport** at all. Our petition asked the council to find a replacement operator for the service. Thank you for all the support and signatures. We submitted our petition to the County Council and await their reply.
