COSSINGTON ROAD DEVELOPMENT

FAYE SPEAKS OUT OVER TRAFFIC CONCERNS

Local campaigner Faye Forde has contacted Charnwood Council with the concerns of residents regarding the Cossington Road housing development now the No. 2 bus route has been slashed. The site was granted planning permission partly because of Sileby's public transport links. The council responded that they do not consider the reduced bus services a good reason to revisit the development.



Faye said: "The Council need to look again at this development. Now there is no bus service to Leicester and, as we have highlighted many times, the train station is still inaccessible to many people. If this development goes ahead, the already busy roads will struggle even more with all the extra traffic".

BUS PETITION UPDATE

COUNCIL SAYS SERVICE WON'T RETURN

The County Council has responded to residents who signed the Green Team's petition asking for a replacement company to be found to take over the axed no. 2 bus service to Leicester.

They stated that there is **no money** available to support such a move. The Council is now assessing whether a 'Dial-a-Ride' service is needed to meet the priority needs of residents in southern Sileby & Cossington.

Naomi says: "We need to get the council to reconsider this decision, or at least arrange a decent dial-a-ride service. It is important that you tell them if the loss of the no.2 is affecting your ability to access work, school, health appointments or essential shopping.
